Strategic Planning:

The Alpha Omicron chapter of the Rho Chi Society holds a strong presence in the University of Pittsburgh School of Pharmacy. Therefore, our plan for the 2016-2017 year was to continue the activities that our predecessors began. In addition, we set three goals for 2016-2017, as we continued to further the mission of The Rho Chi Society. 1)Facilitating academic success: The chapter worked to increase our tutoring impact in the school. Our tutoring co-chairs held multiple large group exam review sessions to prepare first and second year student pharmacists for upcoming exams, and many Alpha Omicron members donated their time for individual tutoring. Furthermore, the chapter worked closely with professors to implement a new remediation program, where students receiving grades below a 70% are required to choose an educational method to improve their performance in the class; one option being to meet with a Rho Chi tutor. 2) Advancing interprofessional fellowship: The second goal of the year was to create a large annual lecture open to students in all health schools, in conjunction with Phi Lambda Sigma, to replace a three-part lecture series that was experiencing low attendance and participation. 3) Inviting faculty to membership: The executive board met with our advisors to review membership bylaws so as, to properly induct a professor worthy of membership into The Rho Chi Society.

The budget for the 2016-2017 school year was presented to the chapter for approval on 10/13/2016, and approved by majority vote.

Initiation Function:

The initiation ceremony was held on Tuesday, March 21st, 2017 at the University Club, which is a prestigious, centrally located building on the Pitt campus. The ceremony was held in conjunction with our School of Pharmacy's Beta Delta chapter of Phi Lambda Sigma. This year, 23 second-year student pharmacists were inducted into the chapter, along with an associate professor from the Department of Pharmacy and Therapeutics. In total, there were 100 guests in attendance at the ceremony. Dean Patricia Kroboth gave the opening remarks, and Dr. William Shrank, Chief Medical Officer in the UPMC Health Plan Division, offered his remarks as well. Dr. Shrank delivered the 61st Annual Julius A. Koch Memorial Lecture the following day. The annual faculty awards for Innovation in Teaching and Outstanding Scholarly Contribution were presented to Dr. Michael A. Shullo and Dr. Phillip Empey, respectively.

Evaluation/Reflection:

As the multitude of student organizations within the University of Pittsburgh School of Pharmacy continue to grow, it is important for our Alpha Omicron chapter of The Rho Chi Society to frequently assess our own activities and outreach to make sure we are aligned with the mission of the Rho Chi Society, are effectively impacting our pharmacy school, and are improving the chapter.

We hosted the first annual Young Professionals Lecture, in conjunction with the school's Beta Delta Chapter of Phi Lambda Sigma. It was an evening lecture that had over 80 students from the various health science schools in attendance and several professors from the School of Pharmacy. The lecture was given by Dr. Jim Withers, MD, who is the founder and director of Operation Safety Net, an organization providing medical care to the homeless population of Pittsburgh, and he was a Top Ten CNN Hero of 2015. The lecture sought to contribute to the development of intellectual leaders and foster collaboration amongst the healthcare fields. The new 2017-2018 executive board plans on holding the lecture again, and trying to reach a greater number of health science students.

The Rho Chi tutoring program was able to reach over 200 students this year through individual sessions, group exam reviews, and assistance with the remediation program. Several professors recognized the unique advantage that peer-to-peer tutoring can provide, and utilized our chapter members to assist students that needed extra help. Additionally, we advertised our free tutoring services at the annual Back to School Picnic, where first year pharmacy students learn about all the organizations within the school.

Our two annual fundraisers, business cards and lab cards, were successful. The funds that we raise are given back to our chapter to further the mission of the Society. Many students appreciate the business cards, especially in their third and fourth professional years, as they increase their networking at conferences and job fairs. This year a medical Spanish vocabulary lab card was added to the collection of lab cards, as our chapter members saw this was a need.

We effectively continued the 'Posters, Professors, and Progress' event, where sixteen professors presented key findings from their research in a round-robin style. Students enjoy seeing how our School of Pharmacy professors are advancing the profession, and this event is an opportunity for students to get involved with professors' research. Similarly, we held the annual Student Poster Event in the spring semester, where fifteen students presented posters that they

had made over the past year from their research with professors. Both events stimulate critical inquiry and enhance collaboration amongst peers and faculty.

It has been an honor to serve as President of the Alpha Omicron chapter over this past school year. I have enjoyed working closely with both our advisors and the members to better the chapter and uphold the unique presence that we have in our School of Pharmacy. Serving as our chapter delegate at the Rho Chi National Meeting was an additional honor, and I was humbled to accept the National Chapter Achievement Award on behalf of our chapter and the hard work of the previous year's members. I have great trust in the incoming 2017-2018 executive board and all of the members, and I am confident that our chapter will continue to flourish.
