Installation Function

The chapter's initiation ceremony took place on Thursday, March 22, 2018 in the Arnold & Marie Schwartz Athletic Center at LIU Brooklyn. This was the 63rd annual induction ceremony of the Beta Theta Chapter.

A total of 60 students were inducted into the Beta Theta Chapter, including 38 PharmD students and 22 graduate students. Deans, faculty members, and administrators of the College of Pharmacy all attended the ceremony to welcome the new inductees. Family members of inductees were also present at the event. The program began with introductory remarks from the Chapter's advisor, Dr. Rebecca Cope, followed by Jessica Soffer, the student president of the Beta Theta chapter, who delivered remarks about the Chapter's accomplishments throughout the 2017-2018 academic year. Dean John Pezzuto welcomed all attendees and then introduced the keynote speaker, Dr. Edward Fisher, Dean of the College of Pharmacy at Ketchum University. Dr. Fisher has been employed in academia for more than 25 years at three colleges of pharmacy: Southwestern Oklahoma State University College of Pharmacy; Midwestern-Glendale as the first Chair of the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences; and Daniel K.

Inouye College of Pharmacy, University of Hawaii at Hilo, as inaugural associate dean. At the University of Hawaii at Hilo, he also served as the director of the MS in Clinical Psychopharmacology program. As former National Secretary of Rho Chi, and a recipient of the National Rho Chi Advisor of the Year award, he has been integral in initiating two new Rho Chi chapters.

Dean Fisher delivered an inspiring address that encouraged students to form and maintain connections throughout their pharmacy career. Following the keynote address, Dean Fisher received a token of appreciation from Dr. Rebecca Cope, advisor of the Beta Theta Chapter. Subsequently, Dr. Cope and the Rho Chi officers performed the initiation ritual, following by

closing remarks by Dr. Cope. Finally, the ceremony concluded with a reception for all those in attendance.

Evaluation/Reflection

The Beta Theta Chapter had a successful academic year. The peer-tutoring program was once again able to provide extra academic support to pharmacy students, and was further customized by asking the students to provide the course/subject area when setting up an appointment to allow tutors to prepare. Students were able to walk in during the designated tutoring hour each week and also schedule appointments to meet with tutors at other times. Involving other members of Rho Chi in peer tutoring was also beneficial, and should be continued in the upcoming year.

Additional activities that benefited the students at LIU Pharmacy included the coordination of four professional development programs, which covered topics such as APPE and internship opportunities, successful interviewing strategies, and career path advisement for students interested in a career in industry.

The officers also coordinated an off-campus community service event to raise money for Alzheimer's research. This community service event was different from the recent past as it allowed students to collaborate with other organizations on campus to collectively raise money for research.

Looking towards the future, the Beta Theta Chapter hopes to continue to serve as role models and morale-boosters for students at LIU pharmacy. The Chapter hopes to continue to provide tutoring services in the pharmacy student study center, both by officers and other members of the Chapter. The Chapter also hopes to foster a sense of comradery between faculty and students at LIU Pharmacy, recognizing that professional relationships built at this stage in a student's career can have a beneficial impact post-graduation. The current officers hope that the Chapter continues to build on its accomplishments and plan to remain in contact with the incoming officers to provide any assistance.
