Delta Pi has also done an APPE preparation panel including local preceptors, faculty members, and a current P4 who demonstrates excellence during his or her rotations. This is a recurring event that has been done for the past 6 years. This panel allows P3s to ask questions detailing how to prepare for the first day of a rotation, how to navigate issues that may come up during a rotation, and how to go above and beyond to make a positive, lasting impression on preceptors.
