Strategic Planning: What goals were set that relate to the Rho Chi mission?

For the 2017-2018 academic year, the Gamma Iota chapter of the Rho Chi Honor Society of Campbell University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences set goals to help the entire college of pharmacy by providing service opportunities, such as bake sales and jean's days to raise money for local charities to support the Rho Chi mission. Additionally, our chapter aspired to contribute to the development of intellectual leaders in pharmacy and promotion of high ethical standards by inducting members who were in the highest academic standards and providing all members information about residency opportunities

for after graduation. Next, the Gamma Iota chapter strives to encourage intellectual achievement, stimulate critical inquiry and foster collaboration. This was completed by hosting weekly tutoring hours at varied times to accommodate all students, whether they be in the old or new curriculum.

Activities

Our Intellectual Leadership activity was solely focused on tutoring. Being a Rho Chi tutor was optional for all Rho Chi members. Of the 10 on-campus members during the 2017-2018 year, we had 6 of them participate in Rho Chi tutoring throughout the year. With the new pharmacy curriculum, the tutoring every day from 2-4 pm was no longer an option. Therefore, we changed our hours to allow for tutoring from 5-7 pm, 6-8 pm or 7-9 am to accommodate all student's differing schedules. This tutoring was free to all students, with an open-door policy in the PSEB/Rho Chi tutoring room of Maddox Hall. These tutoring hours were advertised by announcements in the classroom at the beginning of each semester and a reminder in the Weekly Announcement email that was sent out each Monday.

Rho Chi also held a bake sale and jean's day in the fall semester, where we raised money and donated it to the National Parkinson's Foundation.

Financial Budgeting

We hosted a jean's day and a bake sale to raise money for the National Parkinson's Foundation. To participate in jean's day, students had to pay \$2 to wear jeans to class, but still had to wear professional shirt and shoes. For the bake sale, Rho Chi members helped to bake goods and they were sold over a period of 2 days. On the first day, the items were sold for \$0.50 each, and on the second day, for \$0.25 each.

Installation Function

The annual Gamma Iota Rho Chi induction ceremony was held on March 15, 2018 in Maddox Hall room 117 at Campbell University. We inducted a total of 27 members, including fourth year, third year, and second year doctor of pharmacy candidates, as well as Masters of Science Pharmaceutical Sciences class of 2018 students. Our speaker for the event was Dr. Charles Carter, associate professor of clinical research at Campbell University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. The chapter's advisor Dr. Andrew Muzyk, PharmD lead the induction of new members with the help of the 2017-2018 student officers.

Evaluation/Reflection

This past year, I believe the Rho Chi honor society was successful in some ways, and lacking in others. I believe this past year, we have gone above and beyond in helping with tutoring hours. We had students attend every single week, in all class years. We offered a varied of hours during each week, straying from the traditional 2-4 pm tutoring time slot to accommodate all the different schedules. We received a lot of positive feedback from these

tutoring hours. Additionally, after our new inductees learned they would be inducted, we had a few that wanted to start tutoring right away and not wait until the fall semester. I believe the new inductees will be just as motivated to continue improving our tutoring services.

Where I believe our chapter lacked this past year was with other events. We chose not to host a top 100 review session since the new P1 curriculum did not have a formal Top 100 exam. This was a long standing tradition of the Rho Chi Gamma Iota Chapter and I was disappointed that the chapter voted not to participate this year. I am hoping in the next year, the new officers will elect to bring back this review, even if it is in a different format, based on the changes in the new curriculum. My hope for the next year is that our chapter will continue to grow and expand its current service endeavors to try to reach the community more and grow as an actively involved organization at Campbell University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences.
