Introduction

The Rho Chi mission is to encourage and recognize intellectual achievement, stimulate critical inquiry, and foster collaboration, in order to advance pharmacy through intellectual leadership. The goals set by the Gamma Rho Chapter included establishing a stronger presence within the School of Pharmacy and develop intellectual and active leaders. During the 2017-2018

year, we hosted 3 general meetings this year: Navigating Pharmacy School, Academi-WHAAT?, and Interviewing 101. Through our health outreaches, we promoted the professional of pharmacy, demonstrating the role pharmacists through philanthropic events, such as blood pressure and bone density screenings, brown bagging, and educating the community on various health topics. Our primary topic at health fairs was pain management, focusing on OTC and non-pharmacological interventions. Additionally, given the relevance of opioids in society, we discussed the use, and misuse of prescription opioids. Lastly, with the support of our School of Pharmacy, we developed the Tutoring Learning Center, a dedicated place on campus where fellow pharmacy students can seek academic mentorship from Rho Chi members on a daily basis. Through the leadership in the organization, and the involvement of all its members, Gamma Rho Chapter of Rho Chi society has taken a substantially more involved role in the school and in the community.

Initiation Function

Prior to the initiation, a meeting will be held with current and new Gamma Rho chapter members. During this meeting, the new inductees are congratulated for their academic achievement, and learn about the mission of Rho Chi Society. After the introduction, the members will have an opportunity to give a speech and run for a board position, in which all Gamma Rho members will vote.

The Gamma Rho chapter Initiation Banquet will take place on Thursday, the 14th of June, at the Wong Kerlee International Conference Center at Loma Linda University, in Loma Linda, CA. Expected attendees will include all current officers, current members, new inducted members and family and friends, faculty advisor, guest speaker, School of Pharmacy faculty and staff. Dinner will be provided to all attendees, while a slideshow will be looping, showcasing the involvement of Rho Chi members in the school and in the community. The keynote speaker is Victor Law, R.Ph., President of Alpha Medical Pharmacy, Vice President of California State Board of Pharmacy, and Rho Chi member from University of Oklahoma. Mr. Law has shown active involvement in the community, and visible encouragement to students. He will give a presentation focused on becoming a leader and encouraging involvement in the advancement of pharmacy, both as a student and as pharmacists.

The evening will proceed with the induction ceremony of the new members, where they will be presented with certificates, and pins. The new officers will also be installed during the banquet and will be presented to the chapter. The Outstanding Member of the Year will be recognized.

Evaluation/Reflection

The Rho Chi Honor Society Gamma Rho Chapter focused on reaffirming the greater responsibilities implicated with Rho Chi membership. As the seasons passed, we were able to sow the seed, and establish an organic presence within the School of Pharmacy, while propagating camaraderie among the Gamma Rho chapter members.

Recognizing the role we have as academic and professional leaders, we were passionate to be more involved with our school. Our strategy is to host a general meeting each quarter, opened to all students at our school. To kick off the Fall Quarter, our diverse chapter members performed a Q&A session with the first-year students to help them navigate through the landscape of pharmacy school by pruning myths and planting tips. We had hopes that all the new students feel welcomed in their transition to our school after hearing our sage advices! Stimulating critical inquiry and collaborations are key components of the Rho Chi Society mission. We were overjoyed at the turnout to our 1st Annual ACCP & Rho Chi Society Academia Showcase, "ACADEMI-WHAAT?" We were extremely excited to have Dr. Rashid Mosavin represent Administration, Dr. Lisa Hong represent Clinical Pharmacy, and our faculty advisor Dr. Maskiewicz represent Pharmaceutical. They all shared their experiences in fertilizing and cultivating the next generation of healthcare professions! Given the success of this meeting, we plan on hosting another general meeting this year, creatively named "Interviewing 101: Investigating the Intricacies of Interviews". We asked the LLUSP residency director, Dr. Norm Hamada, to talk to our students about the extremely important subject of preparing for interviews, and how to set oneself apart from the crowd.

Learning is powerful when it comes from a professor but, it means even more coming from one's peer. This year, we took a more active role in our peer tutoring on campus in order to achieve our epic mission of advancing intellectual leadership. Through our flourishing relationship with our school, our chapter advanced the integration of the Rho Chi Society members within the School of Pharmacy, through the pollination and germination of the Tutoring Learning Center that serves all students Monday through Thursday. The goal was to allow for Rho Chi Society members to have more opportunities to serve our students academically. We hope that everyone was able to benefit from our more consistent schedule this year!

As leaders and health care providers, we had a goal of contributing back to our community, through participation in health outreaches. Through our involvement in 6 different health outreaches this year, we were able to make an impact in hundreds of community members and patients! We hope to continue strengthening our relationship with local institutions, such as YMCA, TELACU, Redlands Market Night, CSUSB, LLU. Not only did we have the opportunity to educate and talk to the community, but we also fostered networking among students and organizations. We were able to mentor many of the students and introduce them to what we do as Rho Chi members. Since many of these health fairs were done in collaboration with other organizations, we hope to make these events annual opportunities.

This year has been very busy, yet very rewarding! All this would not have been possible without the dedication of our passionate members, resident advisors, Dr. Jane Litwak and Dr. Emily Limberg, and our faculty advisor, Dr. Victoria Maskiewicz. As the year nears the end, we can only remain excited at how our chapter will sprout and blossom under the leadership of the new Rho Chi Society inductees.

Other Information

Compared to the previous year, our Rho Chi tutoring service underwent a lot of changes. First, we shifted from using individual booking system SetMore to Canvas, the system used by the school to make the appointment with the professors. With the convenience of having only one system to make appointment with both the professors and the tutors, we aimed to target more students to our session. Besides, this allowed the professors to see our availabilities on the system, so that they could refer the students to us when the office hours were too packed. Another highlight that we made for this year was offering the 2 hour-tutoring daily from Monday to Friday at a room reserved for our Rho Chi. With this consistency, we have broadened our availabilities to the students as they could meet us right after classes to discuss the materials that were still fresh in their minds. Our emphasis on each tutoring session was not reteaching the students but rather offering a discussion experience. This created an active learning environment as well as made the student more comfortable to talk to us about their issues. Also, for each session, we provided at least two tutors available to assist the students. The tutoring experiences were either one on one tutoring and or group tutoring if we have a lot of students on that day. The tutors were encouraged to teamwork and assist each other to make sure the students understand the materials and get the best out of the session. In order to evaluate our success, we collected feedback surveys from the students at the end of each tutoring session. We plan to use the data to improve our tutoring services, so that we can best serve our students!
