Financial Budgeting

The Rho Chi chapter budget includes dues collected from initiates and funds remaining from previous years, which were used to purchase medallions and keypins for the new initiates. No additional funds were expended for any event this year.

Installation Function

Our initiation ceremony for new members was held on October 9, 2017 on Auburn's campus. The initiation of Mobile students took place on November 7, 2017 on the Mobile campus. Both initiation ceremonies were held later in the semester than anticipated due to inclement weather. Dr. Kimberly Braxton-Lloyd, Assistant Dean for Health Services, Director of Auburn University Pharmaceutical Care Center, and a faculty member at the Harrison School of Pharmacy, was the Keynote Speaker. Incoming Rho Chi initiates were given a medallion, a keypin, and a membership certificate. Twenty-nine PharmD candidates and five graduate students were initiated into our chapter.

Evaluation/Reflection

This year's greatest strength of our chapter was the continuation of our peer mentor program and student study hall. Students that were in academic difficulty frequently expressed their need to

gain study strategies and testing tips from another student as opposed to their assigned faculty mentors. We were able to reach out to these students who expressed a need for further academic guidance. Our program was highly successful, and faculty members received feedback about how much students enjoyed being able to interact with their peers and get advice directly. The study hall provided near final exams allowed opportunities for all students, whether struggling in school or excelling, to ask questions and learn how to successfully conquer finals week. These events allowed Rho Chi to give back to the school through service and intellectual leadership.

As an area of improvement for our chapter, we hope to build on past successes by continuing to be an active organization on campus by providing more activities to our members and the student body, which supports Rho Chi's ideals of intellectual achievement, critical inquiry, and fellowship. We can do so by holding timely chapter officer meetings to organize events for the year, increasing the number of Rho Chi members in attendance at each event, and improving communications and coordination with the Mobile campus. In addition to the peer mentor program, school-wide events such as study skills workshops have also been planned in order to further the scholarly mission of Rho Chi. Our plans consist of more student involvement in meetings, such as research presentations. We hope in the future to raise funds to host speakers and provide more seminars in order to reach out further to our fellow pharmacy students. Next year, we also hope to reintroduce the tradition of our chapter sponsoring a speaker for our Professional Seminar course.
