Strategic Planning: What goals were set that relate to the Rho Chi mission?

Our goals really aimed to target all components of the Rho Chi mission. We were very active as a chapter this year receiving much notable recognition from many administrators such as the Dean and Assistant Dean as well as many other faculty members. Our main focus this year was really to try to make a difference in the lives of others both on and off campus through continuing to tutor students and through our participation in service events which advance the field of pharmacy as well as have an impact on healthcare overall.

Activities

Be The Match we have proposed a plan to spread the word for Be The Match which is a program that helps match people in need of a bone marrow or stem cell transplant with a compatible healthy donor. While oftentimes, many of us do not realize how critical programs such as these are to people suffering from very debilitating illnesses, many of us have become more aware of the need to seek those willing to donate because there are most likely several people even in our own lives who may not be here today if it were not for those brave enough to register for this program.

Financial Budgeting

There was not much that we needed to spend money on this semester other than the induction ceremony. Exact information regarding expenses are still being processed by the college so we do not have exact information about the exact total costs at this time. They did however provide us with an estimated balance upwards of \$600 after all fees and payments have been applied.

Fundraising:

- 1. Dodgeball Tournament: Made t-shirts, sold tickets, sold concessions for the event
- 2. Dress-Down-Day: Our school enforces a dress code so a fundraiser that can be approved by the Assistant Dean allows an organization to charge students \$3 per person to wear more comfortable clothing as a form of a fundraiser. Many students participate in these events since they are only approved a couple of times per semester.
- 3. March Madness Pool: sold squares similar to Super Bowl Squares but instead applied this concept to the Championship game during the March Madness tournament.
- 4. Charitable donations: St. Jude \$100 and D'Youville Annual Golf Tournament Chocolate Lovers Raffle Basket (contributions to the raffle basket being donated by current Rho Chi members)

Installation Function

The Induction Ceremony took place at our school's banquet hall area on April 30th, 2018. Attendees included new initiates, current Eboard members, Rho Chi chapter advisors, various faculty members (including the Dean and Assistant Dean), and family members/friends of the new initiates. The speaker for the event was past Dean Dr. Gary Stoehr who helped to found our Rho Chi chapter.

Evaluation/Reflection

Rho Chi Epsilon Beta recognizes that our activities are the lifeblood of our organization. The activities conducted this year were multifaceted, consisting of charity, service learning, and fundraising. Although we acknowledge our accomplishments, we understand there is room for improvement. Our fundraiser consisted of the dodgeball tournament which raised over \$300 and involved over 24 participants and many more spectators. We expect to continue this event next year and expand the participation by advertising. We plan on posting flyers on campus and expanding beyond the School of Pharmacy to create an event that is an annual D'Youville event which includes all factions of the school. We also conducted charitable events such as our NCAA Men's March madness bracket. This event used randomized squares for students to test their luck in the championship game. The person whose square consisted of the last numbers in the final score won \$100. We then donated \$100 of the proceeds to St. Jude as charitable donation. We also plan on conducting this event in the coming years, however we want to expand on this idea and try to fill up two sets of squares in order to create a larger donation. Our students loved the idea of helping out this great charity and being a part of the March Madness fun. This event also displayed the work ethic that our chapter has in selling 100 squares within a couple days. In the coming years we also have talked about creating creative ways to donate money to other local foundations. We also conducted a bone marrow drive where we went around campus and swabbed people's mouths to sign them up for the national bone marrow registry. In pharmacy school we

learn about how important bone marrow transplants are to patients, therefore we wanted to do as much as we could in order to help. We also plan on continuing this event next year in order to get as many people signed up as possible. One idea planned for next year is creating a chili cooking competition in which our professors would make their best batch of chili and we would sell the chance to taste and vote on their favorite chili. The winner would be crowned the chili champion and all proceeds would go to a local charity. Our ideology with our events are to have as much fun with them as possible in order to attract as much participation as we can. We know that as Rho Chi members we can make a difference and we intend to put our best effort in doing so.

Other Information

Scholarship Fund:

As a chapter, we have done quite a bit of fundraising this year. From these additional funds, we have created a scholarship fund to be given out at next year's induction ceremony – The Rho Chi Continuous Commitment Award. This type of recognition further encourages our members to be go above and beyond to be involved in expanding our Rho Chi chapter in accordance with the Rho Chi mission. The scholarship fund has specific requirements that must be met: 3.0 GPA minimum, attend at least 1 Rho Chi service learning/co-curricular event within the application period, active participation in at least 1 Rho Chi Fundraiser (including but not limited to helping to raise money, set up for events etc.). Applicants are expected to submit a maximum of a one-page essay (single spaced) stating their involvement within Rho Chi and commitment to advancing within the field of pharmacy. Applications will be reviewed by the Rho Chi Advisors and up to 2 winners (potentially more depending on budget and advisor discretion) will be selected within 10 days of the application deadline.

New Position: with 2 concurrent major proposal ideas

As the current president (technically, now the immediate past president) I had reached out to the Rho Chi national office to discuss the idea of starting a new position within our chapter after reviewing the bylaws. "Chapter Proposal Liaison" is the new position that was voted on by the chapter which allows a member who would like to take on a greater responsibility within the chapter to work on the proposed ideas for the upcoming semester. I was voted into this position with the intentions of utilizing the help of such a strong group of intellectual individuals to further our Be The Match initiative as well as to work on starting up another new proposal called "Rho Chi – Going Places" which would be directed towards helping P1, P2 and even P3 professional students get into contact with preceptors of various specialties in order to set up "rotation-like" experiences for students which are often not available for students. Although this is difficult to explain on paper how this experience differs from actual rotations, the implications of this program provide much room for growth and opportunity for our students. For example, if a student is interested in psychology, there are not any available full IPPE rotation sites available for any students other than P4s. Through this program, we would have a predefined list of preceptors willing to take an eager student for a day or two on site. The student would have to submit a letter of interest through this

program in collaboration with our IPPE/APPE offices. This opportunity gives students greater access to more specialized care as opposed to general community or staff-hospital pharmacy and thus could encourage students to seek residencies or other forms of higher education in accordance with the Rho Chi mission.
