Strategic Planning: What goals were set that relate to the Rho Chi mission?

Our chapter's first goal was to continue the newly set tradition of effectively initiate the 2018-2019 chapter during their second semester of their second year of pharmacy school so that they have their whole third year to be an active member of Rho Chi and contribute to the mission of Rho Chi to a higher standard than our school has in the past. In the upcoming school year, we are looking to increase awareness of our tutoring programs as well as encourage more active members to participate. There were no outreach or community activities that were conducted during the 2017-2018 school year. This year our chapter held it's first fundraiser that consisted of a pancake breakfast available to all faculty and staff. Next year, we
