# **Changes to Chapter Report Process**

Update provided by Emmanuelle Schwartzman Chair, Awards Committee



This past year as part of the objectives set forth in the new Rho Chi strategic plan, President-Elect Emmanuelle Schwartzman and former Region II Councilor Lucio Volino began the process of updating and streamlining the report format and rubric to better align with the updated strategic plan. Input was gathered from the Rho Chi Executive Councilors and the Executive Board. The new format and rubric will be presented to the general assembly at the Rho Chi Annual Meeting in the Spring of 2020. The new format will be developed further to function as an online submission database to make the report process more streamlined for all. Some key features of the new format include specific instructions with examples of what is required in each section, word limits, and more focus on intellectual activities as well as alumni involvement.

Overall, the new report structure will require chapters to be more succinct in their descriptions with a focus on the quality of the activities rather than quantity. We envision this new report structure will encourage chapters to further embrace initiatives which focus on the core objectives of the society: encourage and recognize intellectual achievement, stimulate critical inquiry to advance pharmacy, contribute to the development of intellectual leaders, promote highest ethical standards, and foster collaboration.

Attendees were privileged to hear Dr. Mary Ensom, recipient of the 2019 Rho Chi Society Lecture Award present her lecture.

"How Kindergarten Prepared You for the Challenge of Responsibly Leading Our Profession"

Mary H.H. Ensom, Pharm.D., Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, University of British Columbia

Dr. Mary H. H. Ensom received both the B.S. Pharmacy and the Pharm.D. degrees from the University of Kentucky in 1977 and 1985, respectively. She completed a Fellowship in Clinical Pharmacokinetics at the University of Kentucky (1985-7) and has been on faculty at Pharmacy programs at Kentucky (1987-1997) and the University of British Columbia (1997-2018). Her research has focused on the effects of various pathophysiologic states on clinical pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics, novel approaches to therapeutic drug monitoring, and integration of basic and clinical sciences for translational research.

Dr. Ensom served as the co-advisor for Delta Gamma Chapter from its inception in 2010 to 2018 and was involved in the petition to establish it as the first and, to date, only Canadian chapter of the Society.
