

Dr. Cathy Worrall is the Associate Dean for Admissions & Student Affairs and Professor in the Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Outcomes Sciences at the Medical University of South Carolina College of Pharmacy (MUSC). Formerly a critical care registered nurse, Dr. Worrall earned her Pharm.D. at the University of Florida, then completed a residency in critical care and nutrition support therapeutics at the University of Tennessee - Memphis. Following residency training Dr. Worrall worked as a critical care clinical pharmacy specialist at the Mayo Medical Center in Rochester, Minnesota, where she started Mayo's Critical Care Pharmacy Residency Program. She later accepted a position at MUSC where she specialized in burn, trauma and nutrition support until she transitioned 11 years ago to the Dean's Office at the College of Pharmacy. Her current research interests include the scholarship of teaching and learning, specifically in the areas of student pharmacist personal and professional development.
