Jeanne Frenzel, PharmD, PhD is a Professor in the School of Pharmacy at North Dakota State University, Fargo, ND. She is a pharmacist and experienced educator who supports the development of students into pharmacists through creative instruction in a pharmacy skills laboratory. Her research and published works focus on the use of innovative pedagogies to increase student knowledge and engagement. Dr. Frenzel received BS degrees in Pharmaceutical Sciences and Microbiology, a PharmD degree, and a PhD in education from North Dakota State University. She completed a PGY1 residency at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Fargo, ND. Dr. Frenzel was named Distinguished Young Pharmacist of the Year by the North Dakota Pharmacists Association. She has received local and national teaching awards for her original approaches to teaching and her work with pharmacy students. Dr. Frenzel has received the Peltier Award for Innovative Teaching, the Mary Berg Award for Excellence in Teaching, the Award for Excellence in Course Assessment, and School of Pharmacy Faculty Preceptor of the Year from NDSU. She has also been recognized by the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy through receipt of the Innovations in Teaching Award, Laboratory Innovation and Teaching Excellence Award, and Emerging Teaching Scholar Award. Dr. Frenzel has been advisor to the Kappa Chapter of the Rho Chi Society since 2006. She served two terms as Region V - Regional Councilor from 2013 to 2017.
