Biographical Statement

Dr. Duke graduated from UNC-Chapel Hill with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree in 1989. She completed a specialty residency in critical care pharmacy at MCV Hospitals in Richmond, Virginia. Following her residency, Dr. Duke completed a two-year fellowship in critical care at VCU. In 1992, she joined the faculty at The University of Texas College of Pharmacy as a Clinical Assistant Professor in the satellite campus at UTHSC-San Antonio. In 1997, Dr. Duke became Director of Experience Programs at the University of Georgia College of Pharmacy. She was promoted to Assistant Dean of Experience Programs in 2001. She also served as Interim Lead for Curricular Affairs for 18 months during 2019-2020. Dr. Duke currently leads an experiential division of 11 faculty and 3 staff members. Dr. Duke has authored 3 book chapters and 21 peer-reviewed papers. In 2007, she was honored as a co-recipient of the Rufus A. Lyman Award. She has been an invited speaker at numerous national and state professional meetings and workshops as well as serving as a consultant for college of pharmacy experiential program operations. Dr. Duke was a founding member of the Southeastern Pharmacy Experiential Education Consortium (SPEEC) and led this group from 2003-2006. Dr. Duke has been actively involved in AACP through participation in experiential education section leadership (2011-2014), various experiential education committees, institute meetings, and completion of the Academic Leadership Fellow Program in 2006-2007. She was appointed to the ACPE Board of Directors by AACP from July 2014 – June 2020 and served as President in 2019.
